

EASTER GREETINGS TO YOU ALL ALLELUIA! ALLELUIA! ALLELUIA! THE LORD HAS TRUELY RISEN INDEED ALLELUIA! ALLELUIA! ALLELUIA!

Dear Beloved Priests, Religious Brothers and Sisters, and Laity of our beloved Diocese of Gizo. Before moving on into the 4th month of our journey for this year 2024, as the Bishop Shepherding our Diocese, I want to say;

Thank You very much indeed for all your contribution in whatever form of service, Big or Small that you have rendered in serving the people of God in our Diocese.

On Palm Sunday, as a Diocese, together with the Universal Church, we commemorate the Lord's Triumph Entry into Jerusalem. As he entered into Jerusalem, crowd welcome him, shouting at the top of his voices: HOSANA! waving palms and spreading their clothes on the on the road. He rode an animal (donkey) as he began his journey into Jerusalem, to Calvary and to the Cross.

Why crucify him? Because their expectation was not met. They thought that this is the man who will liberate them from the power of the Romans.

He was led along the rocky road that leads up to Calvary. He fell 3 times, since he hasn't got any strength

left. There on the hill he was stripped of his clothe, mocked and was nailed to a Cross, died, buried, but, three (3) after, some women came from the tomb with the message that He is Alive, He is Alive, He has Risen from the death. Death has no power over him.

After journeying through the Holy Week as from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday, celebrating the great mystery of Easter Triduum, what is your story and experience of Jesus eating the Passover Meal with his Apostles; the suffering Jesus carrying his Cross up the road that leads to Calvary, where he was crucified, died and was buried; and the Risen Jesus, where on the 3rd day, the women proclaimed he is Alive, Jesus has Risen from the death?

This Year 2024 is a very important year for our beloved Nation Solomon Islands. Why is it important? It is important because this year we will be having our National Election. It will be a joint election, for Provincial Seat and National Seat. Something that never happened in our Nation before. It will be historical election for our Nation Solomon Islands. It was declared by the Governor General that 17th April as the official Polling Day.

Looking back in history, April was not a good month for our Nation Solomon Islands. We have experienced so many bad things, such as Riots and Natural disasters. POPE FRANCIS: PALM SUNDAY MESSAGE 2024

Pope Francis on Palm Sunday: Jesus Entered Jerusalem as a Humble King.



On Palm Sunday, hundreds of priests, bishops, cardinals, and laypeople solemnly carried large palm branches in procession through St. Peter's Square

to begin the first liturgy of Holy Week. "Dear brothers and sisters, since the beginning of Lent until now we have prepared our hearts by penance and charitable works," Pope Francis said in a soft voice at the beginning of Palm Sunday Mass on March 24. "Today we gather together to herald with the whole Church the beginning of the celebration of our Lord's paschal mystery, that is to say, of his passion and resurrection." Speaking in St. Peter's Square adorned with palms and greenery, the pope invited the crowd to follow in Jesus' footsteps as he entered Jerusalem "so that being made by his grace partakers of the cross, we may have a share also in his resurrection and in his life." Pope Francis chose not to read the homily prepared for Palm Sunday Mass at the last minute without explanation. The 87-year-old pope, who arrived at the Mass in a wheelchair, has had aides read some of his speeches for him in recent weeks. The pope did read the prayers for the Mass and spoke at the end of the liturgy, offering an appeal for peace in Ukraine and prayers for the victims of the terrorist attack in Moscow. In his peace appeal, Pope Francis gave a brief reflection

on the Gospel account of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on a donkey as the Prince of Peace. "Dear brothers and sisters, Jesus entered Jerusalem as a humble and peaceful king. Let us open our hearts to him. Only he can deliver us from enmity, hatred, violence, because he is mercy and the forgiveness of sins," the pope said. Palm Sunday is the only Mass of the year in which two Gospels are proclaimed. The Gospel of Mark's account of Jesus entering Jerusalem on a donkey was read aloud at the beginning of the Mass and later the Passion of the Lord was solemnly proclaimed with a choir singing the words of the crowd. An estimated 60,000 people were at the papal Mass, according to the Vatican Gendarmes. At the conclusion of the liturgy, Pope Francis rode through St. Peter's Square on the pope-mobile greeting enthusiastic pilgrims who waved flags and cheered. Pope Francis has a busy schedule for Holy Week. He will preside over a chrisem Mass in St. Peter's Basilica on Thursday morning before going to a women's prison in Rome to offer Holy Thursday's Mass of the Lord's Supper. The pope is also scheduled to preside over a celebration for the Passion of the Lord on Good Friday at the Vatican and lead the Stations of the Cross devotion in Rome's Colosseum. On Holy Saturday, Pope Francis is set to preside over the Easter Vigil liturgy, where he will baptize new Catholics. On the morning of Easter Sunday, Pope Francis will be back in St. Peter's Square for Mass and will give the annual "urbi et orbi" Easter blessing. At the end of Palm Sunday Mass, Pope Francis said: "And now we turn in prayer to the Virgin Mary. Let us learn from her to stay close to Jesus during the days of Holy Week, in order to arrive at the joy of the Resurrection."

He said that this is a very important election that can move our country Solomon Island.


In his pastoral letter for the 2024 election, he urges every Catholic community to choose people who are well educated; people who are active in our communi-



Liver Disease.



The liver is an organ that sits just under the rib cage on the right side of the abdomen. It can weigh up to 4 pounds (1.8 kilograms). The liver is needed to help digest food, rid the body of waste products and make substances, called clotting factors, that keep the blood flowing well, among other tasks.

Liver disease can be passed through families, called inherited. Anything that damages the liver also can cause liver problems, including viruses, alcohol use and obesity.

Over time, conditions that damage the liver can lead to scarring, called cirrhosis. Cirrhosis can lead to liver failure, a life-threatening condition. But early treatment may give the liver time to heal.

Liver disease doesn't always cause symptoms that

can be seen or felt. If there are symptoms of liver disease, they may include:

- Yellowing of the skin and the whites of the eyes, called jaundice. Yellowing of the skin might be harder to see on Black or brown skin.
- Belly pain and swelling.
- Swelling in the legs and ankles.
- Itchy skin.
- Dark urine.
- Pale stool.
- Constant tiredness.
- Nausea or vomiting.
- Loss of appetite.
- Bruising easily.

When to see a doctor

Make an appointment with your healthcare professional if you have any lasting symptoms that worry you. Seek medical help right away if you have belly pain that is so bad that you can't stay still.

Causes

Liver disease has many causes.

Infection

Parasites and viruses can infect the liver, causing swelling and irritation, called inflammation. Inflammation keeps the liver from working as it should. The viruses that cause liver damage can be spread through blood or semen, bad food or water, or close contact with a person who is infected.

The most common types of liver infection are hepatitis viruses, including:

- Hepatitis A.
- Hepatitis B.
- Hepatitis C.



Ascension of the Lord

Ascension Day for the year 2024 is celebrated on Thursday, May 9th. Ascension Day is held on a Thursday 39 days (40th day of Easter) after Easter Sunday and commemorates Jesus Christ's ascension into heaven. It is often called Feast of the Ascension of Jesus Christ, Ascension Thursday and Holy Thursday.



Pentecost Sunday

Pentecost is a Christian holiday which takes place on the 50th day (the seventh Sunday) after Easter Sunday. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Virgin Mary and the Apostles of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks.
